


Denver Highlights & Foothill Tour


This guided tour will take you on a journey of Colorado history from the Wild West past and the Gold Rush, to present day boom town!

First, we will head out from your hotel to the western foothills and enjoy a visit to Red Rocks Amphitheater. Red Rocks Amphitheatre is a naturally formed, world-renowned outdoor concert and event venue located just fifteen miles west of Denver. Red Rocks Amphitheatre is famous for its starstudded concert roster, natural acoustics, and incomparable ambience as well as its hiking and biking trails. You will take a brief walk from our bus to the top of the amphitheater and enjoy the awe inspiring views. Enjoy the Colorado Music Hall of Fame Museum, or the Trading Post Gift Shop!



Next, we'll enjoy a scenic drive to Lookout Mountain. Our tour guide will share stories of the outrageous lives of the gun-slinging Buffalo Bill Cody and Annie Oakley and visit Buffalo Bill's gravesite overlooking Golden and the Front Range. We will head from here down to the town of Golden, the "almost Capital" of Colorado. The city of Golden was established at the foot of Lookout Mountain in 1859, as prospectors searched for gold in the Colorado hills. This quaint town is the home of the Colorado School of Mines, Miller-Coors Brewery, and historic buildings dating back to 1859, having endured a colorful past ranging from shoot-outs to Prohibition.

After lunch we will take you on a journey of Denver's history from it's Wild West past and the Gold Rush, to present day boom town, considered one of the top places to live in the county! We will see many of Denver's major cultural attractions and landmarks during this scenic driving tour. Included will be sights such as the Historic Larimer Square, Union Station, the Colorado Convention Center and Blue Bear.



We will head to Civic Center Park where we will see the City and County Building, and the Colorado State Capitol. Time allowing, we will have another photo opportunity as we stand at the Mile High Marker on the Capitol steps, where you will view Civic Center Park, the City and County Building and the looming 14,000 foot peak of Mount Evans in the background to the west.
